FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

I am sure that as many of you have followed the news that it is no surprise that Influenza/Flu has been widespread this year across our nation.

Many of our school families have been battling Influenza, strep throat and a variety of other viruses this winter. Here are some helpful hints to cut down on the spread of illnesses:

- We do want your kids in school BUT please remember if you have an ill child, *do not send* them back to school until they are ready and able to handle a full day of classes and activities.
- Please remind all family members to practice good hand hygiene, covering coughs and sneezes with a tissue or sleeve.
- Routinely clean and disinfect commonly used areas and frequently touched surfaces. Flu can remain on surfaces for up to 8 hrs.

SPRING 2018 STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES AT DMS –TUESDAY MARCH 6th

Student-led conferences will continue on March 6th. We have had student-led conferences in place for many years and really believe in the value of the **student** being an integral part of the conversation. *It allows students the opportunity to assume greater control and responsibility of their learning, engage in the process of self-reflection and evaluation, and develop organizational and oral communication skills.* Once upon a time, conferences were almost an “unveiling” of a snapshot of where a student’s grades were at and that simply is not the case anymore with instant access to all sorts of evidence of learning. With Family Web Access and Schoology, students and their parent/guardian can monitor learning daily. Additionally, we encourage families to reach out to staff at any time with specific questions you may have, not just during conferences. This spring we will continue with a slightly modified format that we believe will be very beneficial. We will still continue to have a 15 minute student-led conference hosted by the student’s Tiger Connections Teacher. Parents/Guardians can sign up online [HERE](#) to choose a conference time. Feedback we have received during some of our recent PTP meetings



is that it would be nice to have an opportunity to clarify a question with a specific teacher. Therefore we will have building-wide **“Open Times”** for parents to stop and visit with any teacher they wish. You may find that through Infinite Campus, Schoology, and the individual student-led conference that you do not have a need to utilize the “Open Times” and that is perfectly ok!

Please be mindful that our staff may have a number of students and parents that may want to see them during this short window so a few minutes would be an appropriate amount of time to visit. Additional time before or after our conference evenings can be requested directly from the teacher.

2017-18 ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

At Farmington Area Public Schools, we are committed to providing our students with personalized learning experiences. To best achieve this, we regularly assess students' growth. Various classroom and standardized assessments aid teachers in providing for individual instructional needs and identifying class trends. We strive to consider the whole picture when serving our students. Having multiple types of assessments helps provide a fuller picture of each student's needs.

Farmington Area Public Schools administer two sets of large scale standardized assessments: the Minnesota State Accountability tests and the NWEA MAP tests. We highly encourage you to read more about what each assessment provides for your student(s), and [have provided a chart](#) for this purpose.

Parents and guardians do have the right to request their student(s) not participate in a scheduled assessment. If you wish your child not to take one or more of the planned assessments, please make sure you understand the role of the assessment and complete the appropriate form.

DID YOU KNOW?

Attendance Line: 651-460-1505

If a student will be absent, a parent/guardian must call Dodge Middle School's attendance line at 651-460-1505 between 7:00 AM and 8:15 AM each day of the absence. We ask that parents/guardians provide the reason for the absence at the time they call. The school determines if the absence falls within the excused or unexcused parameters. If the school does not receive a call from the parent/guardian the day of the absence, the student's absence is automatically unexcused.

To request a pre-excused absence, a parent/guardian needs to complete the online "[Request to Waive Unexcused Status of Absence](#)" form (a link to the form is provided here).

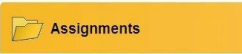
Please note that the form should be submitted at least 5 school days in advance of the absence.
