## **AFTER SCHOOL ACTIVITY: FUTURE CITY COMPETITION**

Is your middle school student interested in engineering? Middle school teams will be forming, starting at our first after school meeting. DMS and BMS will meet together for this activity.

- Location: DMS, room 152 (near pool entrance)
- Starts: Monday, **September 16, 2:35-4:15** → Ends: **Late January**

Students in this competition have a blast working as a team to imagine and then build a city engineered to meet the needs of a community **100 years in the future**. Participants complete five deliverables: a virtual city design (using SimCity); a 1,500-word city essay; a scale model; a project plan, and a presentation to judges at the MN Regional Competition in January.

Future City starts with a question—how can we make the world a better place? To answer it, 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students imagine, research, design, and build cities of the future that showcase their solution to a citywide sustainability issue. **The 2019-2020 theme is “A Clean and Resilient Water Supply”**. Teams will *design a resilient water system for their future city that can withstand and quickly recover from the impact of a natural or man-made disaster*.

Future City takes commitment from its participants. We meet mostly on Mondays, September through November, and then more often in December/January to prepare for the competition. There is no cost to participate. Families will be able to support students with a few low-cost supplies when model cities are being built. Students can learn more from fliers and promotions in each middle school and through Schoology student announcements.

## **DID YOU KNOW?**

### **ATTENDANCE LINE: 651-460-1505**

If a student will be absent, a parent/guardian must call Dodge Middle School's attendance line at 651-460-1505 between 7:00 AM and 8:15 AM each day of the absence. We ask that parents/guardians provide the reason for the absence at the time they call. The school determines if the absence falls within the excused or unexcused parameters. If the school does not receive a call from the parent/guardian the day of the absence, the student's absence is automatically unexcused. To request a pre-excused absence, a parent/guardian needs to complete the online "[Request to Waive Unexcused Status of Absence](#)" form (a link to the form is provided here).

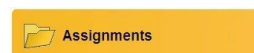


Please note that the form should be submitted at least 5 school days in advance of the absence.
