OPTIONAL SUMMER IPAD CHECKOUT IS BACK FOR 2018-19!

Families with students who currently take iPads home in grades 3-11 may now opt to checkout their issued iPads for the summer months! Last year more than 60% of eligible families and students opted to checkout their issued iPads. Using [FeePay](#) to agree to the updated [2018-19 iPad Loan Agreement](#) and having your child complete the summer iPad checkout process at their current school will also ensure that your child is set with the iPad checkout for the entire 2018-19 school year.

The option for Summer iPad checkout supports our efforts to foster open-ended, personalized learning opportunities; curiosity; exploration and continued access to creative tools and resources.

In addition to typical summer activities, the flexibility of the summer months offers a great time to take advantage of a variety of learning resources from e-books to online resources, to free courses, to the use of digital tools in the creation of original writings, drawings, photos, videos, and music.

In our efforts to better personalize learning opportunities for students, Farmington Area Public Schools will have completed its 6th year deploying iPads in a 1:1 ratio. Unlike earlier years, this year we do not have to collect iPads due to changes in our Mobile Device Management software, new operating system updates, or "end of lease" collections. As a



result, we are again happy to be able to provide families the option of summer iPad checkout. However, similar to previous years, those not opting for summer checkout will have iPads collected at their building before the end of school.

We are excited about this option not only because of the potential for open-ended exploration and creative learning, but also because of the time saved from having to “redistribute iPads” during the first few crucial weeks of school. With the summer iPad checkout, fewer returning students will need to be scheduled through a “fall checkout” process when schools are back in session. This will shorten the amount of time that students and teachers are without iPads in the classroom. Those opting for summer iPad checkout will be set until spring 2019.

The updated [2018-19 iPad Loan Agreement](#), which includes information regarding summer iPad checkout along with other helpful information for iPads deployed during the regular school year, is available online for review. In addition, the [FeePay](#) “iPad” activities are also live for each site allowing parents, guardians, and students the ability to agree to the terms of the [2018-19 iPad Loan Agreement](#) and either ENROLL in or WAIVE participation in the “full year” version of the [iPad Protection Plan](#).

Please see our expanded list of [Frequently Asked Questions](#) for more details on the optional summer iPad checkout, the “full year” iPad Protection Plan, and repair procedures. Later this month, individual schools will share end-of-year collection information for those not choosing to take advantage of this opportunity.

It is recommended families opting to checkout their student’s iPad for the summer use FeePay to review and agree to the 2018-19 iPad Loan Agreement and determine if you want to waive or enroll in the iPad Protection Plan **by Friday, June 1st** for Dodge Middle School. (this date may be different than other school deadlines.) After this date families will not have the option to enroll in the optional summer protection plan. We plan to collect iPads that are not checked out for the summer on Tuesday, June 5th during Tiger Connections.

8th Grade Students

FHS Marching Band and JAQS use iPads during the summer. A school issued iPad is not a requirement, but a device will be needed.

REMINDER FROM THE NURSE TO PICK-UP MEDICATION

It won’t be long and the school year will be over! We are reminding you to please make arrangements to pick up your child’s medications, inhalers, nebulizer equipment, etc. from the nurses’ office. We know that medications are expensive and want to get them back to you. **However, for safety reasons, we cannot send medications home with students and we cannot keep medication over the summer.**

Please arrange to pick up any remaining medication from school between the hours of 7:30 AM-12:30 PM on the last day of school.

If you do not contact us to make other arrangements or come in to get your child’s medication it is assumed that you are giving us permission to dispose of their medication on the last day of school.

Also, please find the attached medication consent form for students who will require medications during school hours next year. This form will need to be filled out, complete with doctors’ signature, and returned to the nurse before the start of the new school year. This form **must be completed annually**. Medications may be brought back to the health office after summer break.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR 7TH GRADE STUDENTS FOR THE 2018-19 SCHOOL YEAR

The health office is planning for the start of the 2018-19 school year! Minnesota immunization law requires that children enrolled in school are to be immunized against certain diseases or file a legal medical or conscientious exemption. As your child is entering 7th grade in September he/she may be due for booster immunizations required for 7th grade enrollment. If you choose that your child will not receive the booster shots an exemption form must be notarized and submitted to the school by September 4. This form can be found on the Health Services Web page at www.farmington.k12.mn.us/ (Services to Health Services to Immunizations and find Student Immunization Form at the bottom of the page).

Proof of the following immunizations or a notarized form indicating you are conscientiously objecting to more immunizations must be provided to the health office no later than the first day of school on September 4, 2018.

- **2 Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) (1st dose must be after age 1)**
- **1 Tetanus Diphtheria Pertussis (Tdap) Booster given after age 11**
- **3 Polio Immunizations**
- **3 Hepatitis B Immunizations**
- **2 Chicken Pox (Varicella) (given after 1 year of age and at least 28 days apart) or date of disease verified by MD**
- **1 Meningococcal Immunization (given at age 11-12)**

Please contact your physician to schedule an appointment to get these taken care of at any time. The offices get busy in the summer. If your child is going out for sport next fall you might also want to consider getting their sports physical done as well.

DID YOU KNOW?

Attendance Line: 651-460-1505

If a student will be absent, a parent/guardian must call Dodge Middle School’s attendance line at 651-460-1505 between 7:00 AM and 8:15 AM each day of the absence. We ask that parents/guardians provide the reason for the absence at the time they call. The school determines if the absence falls within the excused or unexcused parameters. If the school does not receive a call from the parent/guardian the day of the absence, the student’s absence is automatically unexcused.



To request a pre-excused absence, a parent/guardian needs to complete the online "[Request to Waive Unexcused Status of Absence](#)" form (a link to the form is provided here).

Please note that the form should be submitted at least 5 school days in advance of the absence.
